The GO Project Youth Mission Program

You are a part of making the world a better place

Our youth mission programs run for either 8 or 11 days in July and August. Youth in grades 8-age 19 will explore together what justice, outreach and mission look like in their own live and community through our uniquely designed programs each year. Youth will explore faith and justice through unique service projects, such as community kitchens, shelters, community gardens, drop-ins, LGBTQ+ support programs, environmental action projects, and so much more. Youth live together in community; cooking, praying, worshiping and serving together while building life-long friendships and connections.

Top 5 Reasons you should host a GO Project Youth Mission Program in your community:

- 1. To have youth bring energy and live in your community for two weeks.
- 2. To have youth lead worship one Sunday in your community.
- 3. To have a mission project finished in your building or community.
- 4. To deepen your community mission partnerships and gain visibility in your neighbourhood.
- 5. To give the youth in your community, youth from across the country, and volunteers of all ages a life-changing experience.

How much does it cost?

For a community of faith to host a GO Project Youth Mission Program, it costs \$1,000 (host fee).

What does that include? Three to four trained staff to fully implement the program; a full curriculum designed just for your community; administration and promotion support; and registration.

Each camper pays a sliding scale registration fee that goes to The GO Project. Our camp is based on 12 participants attending the program.

Grants like the <u>United Church Vision Fund</u> and local/regional grants can help offset the host fee.

Community Support Requirements

In addition to the host fee, the community of faith hosting will be asked to:

- ✓ Provide space for the program: kitchen access, dining space, sleeping and changing spaces*¹
- ✓ Find billets for the 3-4 summer staff for their prep weeks (communicated in April).
- ✓ Recruit volunteers to bake yummy treats for the youths' stay.
- ✓ Assign a local contact who will act as a liaison before the program begins and to be present when needed during the program. This liaison will also help make local mission site partner connections.
- ✓ Help recruit volunteer drivers for mission trips off-site.
- ✓ Promote program and recruit participants locally.

Promotion

The GO Project will do most of the promotion for the youth program within our national networks. We will provide communities of faith hosting programs with social media posts, bulletin inserts, posters and media releases for local visibility.
















^{*} A note about sleeping spaces: Every church we partner with has different space availability, along with every group and staff having their own safety needs, in combination of these factors a decision will be made about sleeping spaces for each specific program. This may include; segregated sleeping spaces or participants and leaders in one shared space with adequate supervision. The GO Project strives to honor duty of care and the needs of all participants.
